Since 1993 ongoing to 2016 he has been teaching introductory and advanced courses on European Law and Politics (Institutions, European Constitutional Law, Sectoral Policies, Foreign Policy and External Relations) at pre-graduate, graduate and doctoral levels. He has taught as well courses on International Public Law, International Relations and Spanish Foreign Policy.

**2.2.** Since 1999 Executive Director and Founder of the University Institute for European Studies, Madrid, a Jean Monnet Center and a leading Academic Center in research and specialized teaching in European Politics and International Relations. In this capacity, also Director of the Master's Program in European Union Studies, Ortega y Gasset Foundation. Director of the Master's Program in International Relations. Executive Director of the Center on Competition and Regulation and of the Center on Arbitration, Mediation and Negotiation.

**2.3.** He was a Fellow/Visiting Scholar at the Center for European Studies and the Center for International Affairs at Harvard University (1988-1990), Chaim Perelmann Distinguished Visiting Professor at the University of Maryland and Research Professor at the University of Miami (1990-1991). Visiting Professor/Visiting Scholar at the Universities of Berlin, Bonn and
